# 1. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using your telephone equipment, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury, including the following:

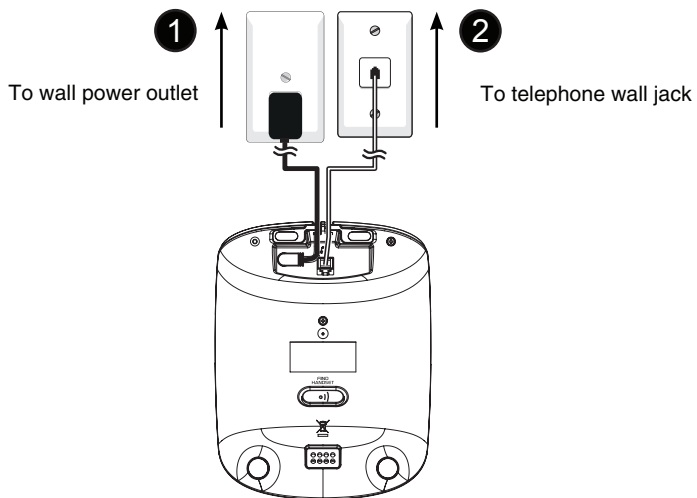
## **2. SET UP THE TELEPHONE**

### **2.1 Package Contents**

- 1 Handset
- 1 Base station
- 1 AC power adapter
- 1 Telephone line cord
- 1 Battery compartment back cover
- 1 NiMH rechargeable battery pack
- User's manual

## 2.2 Connect the Base Station

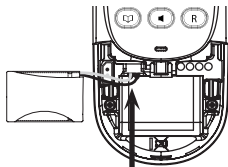

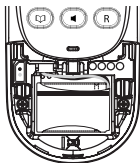
Use only the power adapter supplied with the base station.

## 2.3 Install and Charge the Handset Batteries

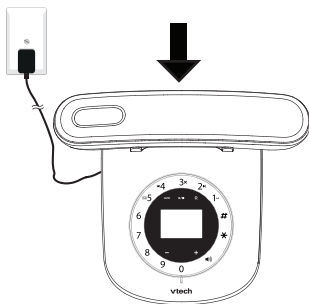

1. Slide open the battery compartment cover. Place the battery pack into the battery compartment, with the battery connector plugged in, as shown.
2. Place the supplied rechargeable battery and the wires inside the battery compartment.
3. Slide the battery compartment cover back until it clicks into place.



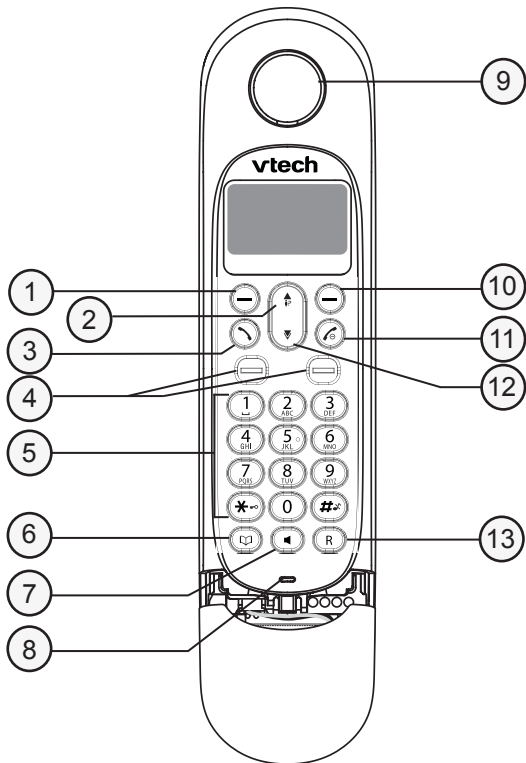
4. Place the handset on the base charging cradle to charge for at least 14 hours. A beep indicates that the handset is properly placed on the base.

### NOTES

- Use only the supplied NiMH rechargeable batteries.
- If you do not use the handset for a long time, disconnect and remove the batteries to prevent possible leakage.

# 3. GET TO KNOW YOUR PHONE

## 3.1 Overview of the Handset



### 1. LEFT SOFT KEY $\ominus$ (MENU/SELECT)

In idle mode: Access the main menu.

In sub-menu mode: Confirm the selection.

During a call: Access Intercom / Phonebook / Redial List / Call List.

2.  **UP/CALL LIST/VOLUME+**

In idle mode: Access the call list.

In menu mode: Scroll up the menu items.

In Phonebook / Redial list / Call List: Scroll up the list.

During a call: Increase the listening volume.

During ringing: Increase the ringer volume.

3.  **TALK ON**

In idle / predialing mode : Make a call.

In Redial list / Call List / Phonebook: Make a call to the selected entry in the list.

During ringing: Answer a call.

4. **CHARGING POLE**

5. **ALPHANUMERIC KEYPAD**

Press to insert a digit / character / \* / #

\* key in idle mode: Press and hold to enable or disable the keypad lock.

\* key during a call (in pulse mode): Switch to tone mode.

# key in idle mode: Press and hold to turn on / off the ringer.

0 key in predialing / number editing mode: Press and hold to insert a pause.

6.  **SPEAKERPHONE**

During a call: Turn on / off the speakerphone.

In Idle mode / predialing mode / Redial list / Call List / Phonebook entry:  
Make a call with speakerphone.

During ringing: Answer a call with speakerphone.

7.  **PHONEBOOK**

In idle mode: Access the phonebook.

8. **MICROPHONE**

9. **EARPIECE**



## 10. RIGHT SOFT KEY (MUTE/DELETE/BACK/INTERCOM)

In menu / editing mode: Press to return to previous menu.

In menu / editing mode: Press and hold to return to idle screen.

In editing / predialing mode: Press to clear a character / digit.

In editing / predialing mode: Press and hold to delete all the characters / digits.

During a call: Press to mute / unmute the microphone.

In idle mode: Press to intercom another handset.

## 11. TALK OFF/CANCEL

During a call: Press to end a call and return to idle screen.

In menu / editing mode: Press to go back to previous menu.

In menu / editing mode: Press and hold to return to idle screen.

In idle mode: Press and hold to power off the handset.

In idle mode (when the handset is powered off): Press and hold to power on the handset.

## 12. DOWN/REDIAL LIST/VOLUME-

In idle mode: Press to access the redial list.

In menu mode: Press to scroll down the menu items.

In Phonebook list / Redial list / Call List: Press to scroll down the list.

During a call: Press to decrease the listening volume.

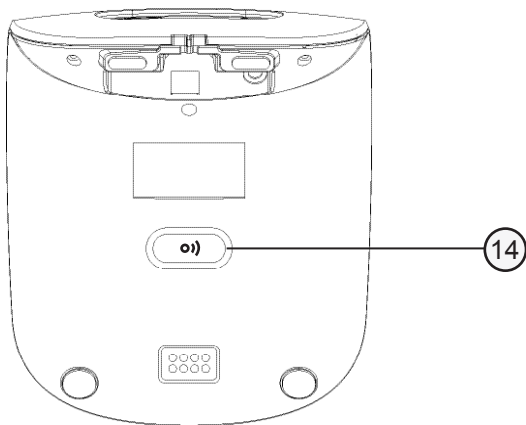
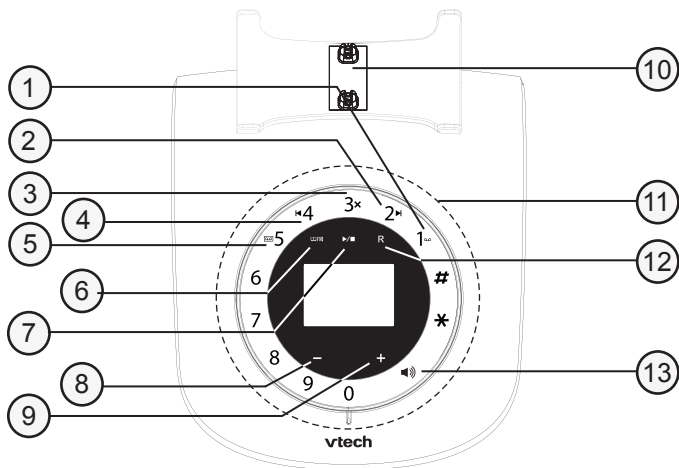
During ringing: Press to decrease the ringer volume.

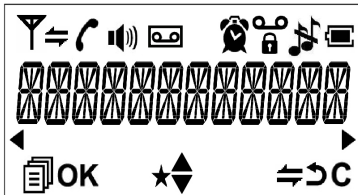

### 3.3 Handset LCD display icons and symbols



The LCD display gives you information on the current status of the telephone.




Display icons	Icons can be Steadily On (visible), Flashing or Off (not visible)
	Scroll up / down the menu items / Phonebook list / Redial list / Call List.
	Steadily on when the handset is with reception range. Flashes when out of range or not registered to the base.
	Steadily on when an intercom is in progress. Flashes when there is an incoming intercom call.
	Steadily on when a call is in progress.
	Steadily on when the ringer is switched off.
	Steadily on when an alarm is set. Flashes when the alarm time set before reaches.
	Steadily on when the keypad is locked.
	Steadily on when a message is received at the telephone service provider.
	Steadily on when the battery is fully charged. Whole icon flashes when the battery is charging.
	Flashes when low battery power level is detected and the handset needs charging.
	Steadily on when more characters are existed before the text currently displayed.

	Steadily on when more characters are existed after the text currently displayed.
	Press to select more menu options if applicable
<b>OK</b>	Press to confirm the current selection if applicable.
	Press to initial an intercom call when idle.
	Press to go back to previous menu level or cancel the current action if applicable.
<b>C</b>	Press to clear a character or stop the alarm if applicable, press to mute / unmute during a call.
	Steadily on when when you have received missed calls.
	Steadily on when the speakerphone is turned on.
	Steadily on when the answering system is turned on.

### 3.4 Base Station Light

	On when the telephone base speakerphone is in use.
	Flashes when there are new memos or messages in the answering system.



7. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** .

### 4.9.3 Delete a Redial Number





1. Press .
2. / → (a desired entry).
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → / → **DELETE**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** .

### 4.9.4 Delete All Redial Numbers

1. Press .
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → / → **DELETE ALL**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  twice.

### 4.10 Find the Handset (PAGING)

Press  on the base.

Press  / **RIGHT SOFT KEY**  /  on handset, or press  on the base to stop paging.

6. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$ .

5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$  → Edit number.
6. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$  → **▲/▼** → **MELODY 1 - MELODY 10**.
7. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$ .

4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** .

## 5.5 Delete All Phonebook Entries

1. Press   
**-OR-**  
Press → **▲/▼** → **PHONEBOOK**. Press /OK
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **DELETE ALL**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  twice.

## 5.6 Check Number of Phonebook Entry Used

You can check how many entries have been occupied in your phone and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.











## 7. PHONE SETTINGS

Your phone comes with a selection of settings that you can change to personalize your phone the way you like it to work.

### 7.1 Date and Time Settings

You will need to set the correct time and date so that you know when you received answering machine (applicable to model with answering machine) or call list entries.

#### 7.1.1 Set the Date Format

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **DATE & TIME**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **DATE FORMAT**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **DD-MM-YY / MM-DD-YY**.
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$ .

#### 7.1.2 Set the Time Format

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **DATE & TIME**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **TIME FORMAT**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **12 HR / 24 HR**.
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$ .

#### 7.1.3 Set the Time

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **DATE & TIME**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **SET TIME**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  Enter time.
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$   $\rightarrow$  **▲/▼**  $\rightarrow$  **AM** or **PM**.

## 7.1.4 Set the Date

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **DATE & TIME**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **SET DATE**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → Enter Date.
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

## 7.2 Handset Settings

### 7.2.1 Alarm

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ALARM**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ON / OFF**.

If **ON** is selected:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → Enter time.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → **AM** or **PM**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖. You will need to set the snooze function.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ON / OFF**.
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

### 7.2.2 Set the Ringer Melody for External Calls

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **RING SETUP**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **EXT. RING**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **MELODY 1 - MELODY 10**.
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

### 7.2.3 Set the Ringer Melody for Internal Calls

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **RING SETUP**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → **INT. RING**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **MELODY 1 - MELODY 10**.
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.



## 7.2.4 Set the Ringer Volume

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **RING SETUP**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **RING VOLUME**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **VOLUME 1 - VOLUME 5**, or **VOLUME OFF**.
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

## 7.2.5 Set Alert Tones

A single beep is emitted when you press a key. You can turn on or off the key tone. You can also turn on the alert tones when low battery and out of range are detected. Low battery tone will be emitted while you are talking with the phone to alert you that you need to charge your battery. Out of range tone will be emitted when the handset is out of range from the base.

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **tone SETUP**.

3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → Enter name.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

## 7.2.8 Set the Handset Display Information

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS DISPLAY**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HANDSET NAME / TIME**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

## 7.2.9 Set the Auto Answer

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **AUTO ANSWER**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ON / OFF**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

## 7.3 Base Settings

### 7.3.1 Set the Base Ringer Melody

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → **BS RINGER**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → (The desired ringer).
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

### 7.3.2 Set the Base Ringer Volume

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **RING VOLUME**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → (The desired volume).
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

### 7.3.3 Set the BASE Language

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **LANGUAGE**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → (The desired language).
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖.

### 7.3.4 Set the Dial Mode

The dial mode settings is country dependent. Please contact your local service provider for the correct settings.

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **DIAL MODE**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **TONE / PULSE**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺.

### 7.3.5 Set the Flash Time

The flash time settings is country dependent. Please contact your local service provider for the correct settings.

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **FLASH TIME**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **SHORT / MEDIUM / LONG**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺.

### 7.3.6 Change the System PIN Code

The default system PIN code is **0000**.

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **CHANGE PIN**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺.
4. Enter old **PIN** (Default: **0000**).
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → Enter new **PIN**.
6. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → Enter new **PIN** again.
7. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺.





### 7.3.7 Set the ECO range

The shorter the operating range between handset and base, the lower the radiation will be emitted.

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **ECO RANGE**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺ → ▲/▼ → **FULL RANGE / HALF RANGE**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☺.





### 7.3.8 Turn the Full ECO On or Off

When FULL ECO is set to **ON**, both the operating range and radiation emitted will be reduced to their minimum.




1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **FULL ECO**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **ON / OFF**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** .





### 7.3.9 Set the First Ring

If you have subscribed to the Caller ID service from your local service provider telephone company, and do not wish to hear the phone ring before the caller ID is displayed, you can set FIRST RING to **OFF**.

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **FIRST RING**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **ON / OFF**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** .




### 7.3.10 Set the Call Share

When Call Share is set to ON, handset and base can establish conference call by pressing  /  on the handset or  on the base during conversation

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **BS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **CALL SHARE**.
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **ON / OFF**.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** .

## 7.4 Reset Your Phone

You can reset your phone to the default settings. After reset, all settings and entries (except phonebook) will be deleted.

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → **▲/▼** → **DEFAULT**.
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  → Enter old **PIN** (Default: **0000**).
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  twice.

# 8 ANSWERING MACHINE

Your telephone base includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone.

## 8.1 Switching Answering Machine On/Off

### Using the handset menu:

Alternatively, you can switch the TAM on or off using the base menu.

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$  → **▲/▼** → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$  → **▲/▼** → **TAM ON/OFF.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$  → **▲/▼** → **ON / OFF.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$ .

## 8.2 Play Messages on TAM

### Using the base direct keys:

- Tap **▶/■** in idle mode.

### Options during playback:

- Press **▲/▼** to adjust the message playback volume.
- Press **2 ▶** to skip to the next message.
- Press **◀ 4** to repeat the message. Press **◀ 4** twice to hear the previous message.
- Press **3x** to delete the playing message.
- Press **▶/■** to stop the playback.

### Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$  → **▲/▼** → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$  → **MSG PLAYBACK.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY**  $\ominus$  → start playing back the messages from speakerphone.

### 8.3 Delete all Messages on TAM

#### Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **DELETE ALL.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ twice.

#### **NOTE:**

You cannot delete new messages, so you will have to play them before trying to delete.

### 8.4 Record Memos on TAM

You can record your memo message for another user. When you record a memo, the message counter will increase by one and the message can be played in the same way as answering machine messages. Memo recording can still function even when the answering machine is turned off.

#### Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **MEMO.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → start recording the memo.
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → stop and save the memo.

**-OR-**

Press **RIGHT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → quit memo recording without saving.

## 8.5 Answering Machine Settings

### 8.5.1 Set the Answer Mode

By default, the answer machine is set in **ANS&REC** mode which allows callers to leave a message. This mode can be changed to **ANSONLY** which does not allow callers to leave a message. In that case, your callers will be prompted to call back later.

**Using the handset menu:**

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **ANSWER MODE.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **ANS & REC / ANSWER ONLY.**
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹.

### 8.5.2 Set the TAM Language

You can choose the voice prompt language of the answering machine from a total of 3 languages.

**Using the handset menu:**

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **TAM LANGUAGE.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → (a desired voice prompt language for answering machine).
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹.

### 8.5.3 Record your Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can record your own OGM for ANS & REC mode or ANSWER ONLY mode. When you record your own OGM, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call. If your personalized OGM is deleted, the pre-set OGM will be restored automatically.

**Using the handset menu:**

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **OGM SETTINGS.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS & REC / ANSWER ONLY.**
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **RECORD MESS.**
6. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → start recording OGM.
7. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → stop and save the OGM.  
**-OR-**  
Press **RIGHT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → quit OSG recording without saving.

### 8.5.4 Playback the Outgoing Message (OGM)

**Using the handset menu:**

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → **OGM SETTING.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → **ANS & REC / ANSWER ONLY.**
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → **PLAYBACK.**
6. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → playback OGM.
7. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → stop OGM playback.

**NOTE:**

If a personalized OGM is not recorded before, the pre-set OGM will be played.



## 8.5.5 Delete a Personalized OGM (SET OGM to DEFAULT)

Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **OGM SETTING.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS & REC** or **ANSWER ONLY.**
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **PLAYBACK.**
6. Press **RIGHT SOFT KEY** ⊖ – Delete OGM.

## 8.5.6 Set the Answer Delay

You can set the number of rings before the answering system answers and starts playing your OGM.

Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANSWER DELAY.**
4. Scroll **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → (a desired answer delay option).
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ .

## 8.5.7 Set the Recording Time of Incoming Message

You can set the maximum length of the recording time of the incoming messages.

Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → **RECORD TIME.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ → ▲/▼ → (a desired recording time).
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ⊖ .

### 8.5.8 Change the Compression Rate

Three different compression rates (HIGH, MID and LOW) are provided for you to select different quality levels of recording incoming message. The lower the compression rate, the higher the recording quality level attained, but the shorter the total recording time available.

#### Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → ▲/▼ → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → ▲/▼ → **COMPRESSION.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → ▲/▼ → (a desired compression rate).
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹.

### 8.5.8 Turn On or Off the Base Screening

You can select to turn on or off the call screening on base. When the answering machine is set to ON and when there is an incoming message, the base will start call screening automatically after the preset numbers of rings of answer delay.

#### Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → ▲/▼ → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → ▲/▼ → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → ▲/▼ → **BS SCREENING.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → ▲/▼ → **ON / OFF.**
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹.

## 8.5.10 Activate Remote Access

Your phone lets you check your messages, or otherwise operate your answering machine, by calling the answering machine when you are away from home by entering a 4-digit remote access PIN on a tone-dialing phone. Use the 4-digit remote access PIN code to prevent other people from unauthorized access of your answering machine.

### 8.5.10.1 Change the 4-Digit Remote Access PIN

Using the handset menu:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **CHANGE PIN.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → Enter old PIN (default remote access PIN: **0000**).
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → Enter new PIN.
6. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → Enter new PIN again.
7. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹.

### 8.5.10.2 Activate or Deactivate the Remote access

Using the base:

1. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **ANS. MACHINE.**
2. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **TAM SETTINGS.**
3. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **▲/▼** → **REMOTE ACC.**
4. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹ → **ON / OFF.**
5. Press **LEFT SOFT KEY** ☹.

### 8.5.10.3 Remote Operations

If you are away from your home, you can call your answering machine to switch on or off the answering machine and listen to your messages remotely using another tone-dialing phone.

1. Call from a tone-dialing phone.
2. When the answering machine answers the call and starts playing OGM, press **X**.
3. Enter the 4-digit Remote Access PIN (default PIN: **0000**).
4. Press the following keys to carry out your desired function.

Keys	Functions	
	While message is not playing	While message is playing
2		Delete the current message playback
4		Repeat playing the current message from the beginning. Press twice to skip backward to the previous message.
5	Play the message	
6		Skip forward to play the next message
7	Turn on the answering machine	
8		Stop the current message playback
9	Turn off the answering machine	
*	Enter the 4-digit remote access PIN	

#### **NOTE:**

- When your answering machine memory is full and the answer mode is in **ANS&REC (ANS & RECORD)**, the answer mode will change to **ANSONLY (ANSWER ONLY)** automatically. It will change to **ANS&REC (ANS & RECORD)** mode automatically after some messages have been deleted.

## 9. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you have difficulty with your phone, please try the suggestion listed below.

Problem	Solutions
<b>My telephone does not work at all.</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Make sure the batteries are installed and charged correctly. For optimum daily performance, return the handset to the telephone base after use.</li><li>• Make sure the power adapter is securely plugged into an outlet.</li><li>• Make sure the telephone line cord is plugged firmly into the telephone base and the telephone wall jack.</li><li>• Unplug the electrical power to the telephone base. Wait for approximately 15 seconds, then plug it back in. Allow up to one minute for the handset and telephone base to synchronize.</li><li>• Remove and re-insert the batteries. If that still does not work, it might be necessary to purchase new batteries.</li></ul>
<b>The display shows “No line”. I cannot hear the dial tone.</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Disconnect the telephone base from the telephone wall jack and plug in a working telephone. If the other telephone still does not work, the problem is probably in the wiring or the telephone service. Call your telephone service provider.</li></ul>
<b>Low battery shows on screen.</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Place the handset in the telephone base for recharging.</li><li>• Remove and re-install the batteries and use it until fully depleted, then recharge the handset in the telephone base.</li><li>• If the above measures do not solve the problem, replace the batteries.</li></ul>
<b>The batteries do not charge in the handset or the handset batteries do not accept charge.</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Make sure the handset is placed in the telephone base correctly.</li><li>• Remove and reinstall the batteries, then charge for up to 16 hours.</li><li>• Purchase new batteries.</li></ul>

**There is interference during a telephone conversation. My calls fade out when I am using the handset.**

- The handset may be out of range. Move it closer to the telephone base.
- If you subscribe to high-speed Internet service (digital subscriber line - DSL) through your telephone line, you must install a DSL filter between the telephone base and the telephone wall jack. The filter prevents noise and caller ID problems caused by DSL interference. Please contact your DSL service provider for more information about DSL filters.
- Appliances or other cordless telephones plugged into the same circuit as the telephone base can cause interference. Try moving the appliance or telephone base to another outlet.
- Other electronic products may cause interference to your cordless telephone. Install your telephone as far away as possible from the following electronic devices: wireless routers, radios, radio towers, pager towers, cellular telephones, digital telephones, intercoms, room monitors, televisions, VCRs, personal computers, kitchen appliances, and other cordless telephones.
- If your telephone is plugged in with a modem or a surge protector, plug the telephone (or modem/surge protector) into a different location. If this doesn't solve the problem, re-locate your telephone or modem farther apart from each other, or use a different surge protector.
- The location of your telephone base can impact the performance of your cordless phone. For better reception, install the telephone base in a centralized location within your home or office, away from walls or other obstructions. In many environments, elevating the telephone base improves overall performance.
- Disconnect the telephone base from the telephone wall jack and plug in a corded telephone. If calls are still not clear, the problem is probably in the wiring or telephone service. Contact your telephone service provider (charges might apply).
- If the other telephones in your home are having the same problem, the problem is in the wiring or telephone service. Contact your telephone service provider (charges may apply).

<p><b>The messages on the answering system are incomplete.</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If a caller leaves a very long message, part of it may be lost when the answering system disconnects the call after the preset recording time.</li> <li>• If the memory on the answering system becomes full during a message, the answering system stops recording and disconnects the call.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Common cure for electronic equipment.</b></p>	<p>If the telephone is not responding normally, put the handset in the telephone base. # 10. CARE AND MAINTENANCE

## Take care of your telephone

- Your cordless telephone contains sophisticated electronic parts, so you must treat it with care.
- Avoid rough treatment.
- Place the handset down gently.
- Save the original packing materials to protect your telephone if you ever need to ship it.

## Avoid water

- You can damage your telephone if it gets wet. Do not use the handset in the rain, or handle it with the wet hands. Do not install the telephone base near a sink, bathtub or shower.

## Electrical storms

- Electrical storms can sometimes cause power surges harmful to electronic equipment. For your own safety, take caution when using electric appliances during storms.

## Cleaning your telephone

- Your telephone has a durable plastic casing that should retain its luster for many year. Clean it only with a soft cloth slightly dampened with water or a mild soap.
- Do not use excess water or cleaning solvents of any kind.

## **NOTE**

Remember that electrical appliances can cause serious injury if used when you are wet or standing in water. If the telephone base should fall into water. **DO NOT RETRIEVE IT UNTIL YOU UNPLUG THE POWER CORD AND TELEPHONE LINE CORDS FROM THE WALL.** Then pull the unit out by the unplugged cords.
